«The new Travel Shopper is our essential lightweight item for journeys close and far. It was born from a collaboration between QWSTION and Swiss product designer Sibylle Stoeckli, and unites the focus on simplicity with observations made while traveling into the unknown.

Sibylle Stoeckli navigates between her textile label and her studio where she develops scenography and furniture design. She was one of the first designers to be invited by Qwstion to present her products in our flagship store.

In 2012 she initiated Global Design Research, a project involving discussions with designers and craftsmen about their disciplines in context of cultures.

The aim is to reflect on how objects are influenced by cultural habits and how they relate to know-how of industry and crafts. In a wider perspective it is a study on sustainability in our globalized world.

After returning from her research trip to 26 global cities on all five continents we started collaborating to create a bag that is made for explorers. Like us, Sibylle Stoeckli is constantly questioning norms.»
